Una utilises a Spa Room with lots of filtered light and a fan running for most of the day. She also uses a large deck with shelving for pots and lattice to hang mounts. The single most important factor that she has gleaned from many chats with orchid enthusiasts is that these plants need air flow and do not like to be over crowded. Where possible, Una sits her well-spaced plants on stones in a saucer with water to create the humidity that they need. Una showed us how enthusiasm and a willingness to listen and learn from other orchid growers has helped her to become a successful grower in just a few years. Thank you Una for this interesting presentation. Your talk is sure to inspire beginning orchid growers.



At the next meeting...... Friday, April 9th.

Doors open at 1 pm. Benching by 1.30. Meeting commences at 2pm. This month we will have our tea/coffee prior to the meeting. This will give the chance for some social interaction which was not happening when refreshments were at the end of the meeting. Members are asked to keep well clear of the benches whilst sipping and chatting. At the April meeting Jean Swindley will talk to us about Specimen plants and their associated problems. Using her award winning Dinema polybulbon as an example, Jean will show us how she has dealt with it, both successfully and not so successfully. Novice Members and others are invited to bring along plants for growing advice. These should be free of pests and disease. The questions below might be some that members would like answered: Why is this plant not flowering? It looks healthy. Does it need repotting? What should I do with this keiki? How do I deal with roots growing over the rim of the pot? Would this struggling orchid be better mounted? If so, how? My plant is too big for its mount. What do I do?

Monthly Maintenance

*We have certainly had plenty of rain of late and wet potting media and high humidity can lead to fungal problems, so treat with AntiRot or Mancozeb (not Mancozeb Plus) or Eco Carb for a softer treatment.

*Ease off watering (those under cover) and fertilising for many orchids as the days and nights cool. At the same time be aware of those genera which need watering all year round eg. Masdevallia, Sarcochilus, Paphiopedilum, Maxillaria, Miltoniopsis. If you are not sure about the needs of your plants and you can't find the info. you need on line or in a reference book, just ask one of the more experienced growers who will happily advise you.

*Continue to mist mounts regularly making sure that they dry between mistings. There are exceptions to this advice as many Bulbophyllum like to remain moist all the time.

*Check that cold sensitive orchids are in a sheltered place ready for the winter chill.

*Water and mist orchids in the mornings after the night chill has lifted.

*Autumn, for some species, brings flower initiation so be aware of snails and slugs as spikes emerge. Lay your preferred traps for them. They like beer.



*Continue to check for Cymbidium spikes and stake them.

*All pots of terrestrials should be in their growing position for the winter months. It is vital that they receive as much winter sun as possible.

Growers' Workshop April, 17th

It will be great to get back to these practical sessions after their absence in 2020.

This time Gordon Marion will be the host at his home in Tuross Head (14 Oaks Avenue) and the session will commence at 10.30 am. A visit to Gordon's home and his orchid collection is always a great experience and members attending will be very glad they did. Gordon has been growing orchids for many years and he has a myriad of practical tips and pieces of advice on how to give your orchids the best chance possible.



The Club Library







Editor's Orchid Spotlight

Neofinetia falcata x sib ('Koto' x ' Shutenno')

This dainty little orchid was benched by Jean Swindley at the last meeting. Known as the Japanese Wind Orchid or Furan, it can tolerate a wide range of temperatures and prefers medium to lower light levels. Whilst it is traditionally grown in sphagnum moss mounded in the pot with the plant resting on top above the rim of the pot, it can be grown in any medium and may even be mounted with a sphagnum moss pad to keep it moist. Jean's is grown in sphagnum moss not using traditional methods, however it looks very happy and healthy.

It has a perfume which is more pronounced in the evening
