Maintenance.....

- *By now your terrestrials should have been repotted and in a dry spot. Start to look out for green growth so that you can begin a gentle watering regime.
- *The Summer rain has been beneficial for those orchids without cover and the growth has been strong. Keep protecting the tempting new shoots from bugs using your preferred method.
- *Scale can creep into your collection without your noticing until a plant appears to not be thriving and a check reveals an infestation. Often introduced by new plants you haven't 'quarantined' and thriving in crowded conditions in an orchid house, scale is destructive. Catch it early with regular checks of plants and isopropyl alcohol, methylated spirit or just a gentle rub off will all help to deal with it. The next stage is the use of horticultural oils such as Eco Oil and as a last measure, if it is out of control, resort to chemicals such as Carbaryl. Regularly check the back of leaves, stems, top of roots and rhizomes and don't forget to put on your glasses, as immature soft scale can be difficult to see. If scale is an ongoing problem in your orchid house check for ants and eliminate them and consider relocating the ferns under your benches which may host soft brown scale.
- *Regularly dispose of debris in your orchid house as scale and eggs can survive in this and reinfect your plants.

Editor's Orchid Spotlight

Brassia caudata

This lovely Brassia species often called The Spider Orchid, comes from the Central American Region and nearby countries and grows on the bark of trees. Its pollinator is the female spider wasp which mistakes the flower for its prey.

This well-flowered example of Brassia caudata belongs to Barrie McPherson. Well done Barrie.
