At the last meeting......

This was another interesting and practical session which was enjoyed by those brave souls who ventured into the Wintery conditions and there was quite a turn out. Great to see Graham Jackson back at a meeting and lovely to welcome a new member, Joan Morgan from Narooma. Michelle McIntosh had a collection of *Dendrobium speciosum* with her. She was able to show us exactly where the flower spikes will emerge from a plant, not just from between the leaves but also from the eyes on the stem. Michelle expects to see some signs of spikes by Anzac Day but this year they were starting to emerge earlier in April.

Gordon Marion then talked to us about his collection of Tolumnia, the Equitant Oncidiums. He had a selection of his mounted plants and explained that if the flower spike is left on the plant after the flowers have died, that often small plants (keikis) will grow. These can be removed when well developed to create a new plant. Gordon has most success with mounting these plants (they grow on twigs in their natural habitat) and he warned that they do need some warmth in Winter. We look forward to seeing Gordon's wonderful little plants in flower.

Monthly Maintenance

- Generally speaking, most orchids do not require as much day to day care during the winter months.
- After weeding pots, inspecting for pests, making sure plants are not exposed to frosts or cold draughts and seeing to their humidity needs, your orchids will only need fertiliser, if actively growing, and will require less water than they do during hot, summer months.
- Following our recent particularly damp spell, an application or two of your favourite anti-fungal treatment(s) would be advisable.
- With fewer demands from your orchids, you'll be able to concentrate on Show preparation for those orchids which are in bloom.
- Some pre-Show tasks may include cleaning the leaves and the pot, removing weeds, removing any dead sheaths or unsightly leaves, trimming off the dead tips of leaves and making sure the flower is staked securely and showing to its best advantage.
- Wafting insect spray over buds and flowers will deter bug attack. Credit to Neville Roper for that advice.

E.O.C. Spring Show update......

Our regular booking of the Leisure Centre in Narooma in August, which has been advertised for some time, has been gazumped by the Council, as they wish to use the building for pre-polling for this year's Eurobodalla Shire Council Elections.

The Committee did some hurried reshuffling to allow this event to go ahead and the new dates for our Spring Show are September 17th (set up), 18th and 19th. Please make a note of the change.

Wintering Catasetums

A question by a member on the Facebook page 'Orchid Growers Australia' about a leafless orchid bulb which had been pulled out of its pot, elicited lots of great general advice from other growers.

The bulb was identified as a Catasetum, a deciduous orchid, and was in Melbourne in fairly cool conditions. The member asking the question was given this advice.....

- Repot it back into bark, bark and perlite, chunky bark and charcoal or tightly packed sphagnum moss. (The tightness of the moss stops it holding too much moisture therefore preventing bulb rot.)
- Once repotted bring it inside and do not water it for 4 months or until mid- September. Give it a bone dry Winter. Old bulbs will start to shrivel but do not be tempted to water the plant.
- Begin watering and fertilising madly when the roots are 5cm. long, 4 inches long, visible at the bottom of the pot or the new growth is 3 inches long....any of these.

Makes me want to try to obtain one of these beauties.

The 'Guru' of this genus is Fred Clarke, Sunset Valley Orchids. Go to that website (sunsetvalleyorchids.com) then Orchid Culture, Catasetinae Plant Culture and in one page, you'll be fully versed on this amazing creature. Fred Clarke says wait till new roots are well developed and 3" to 5" long before watering.

Jane Wright's guide to commencing watering is that the new leaf growth should be 5" to 6" long.

It is always interesting to visit orchid collections belonging to other growers to see how they utilise indoor and outdoor spaces, fences and walls and how they provide cover and shelter for their orchids. Most orchid growers are also gardeners and manage to mix the two very nicely.

The first visit was to Diane and David Hay's home. They have managed to blend their orchid collection into outdoor and indoor living areas where the plants are both decorative and living in great conditions. David's passion for working with wood was evident in the many lovely containers, holders and mounts he has used.

The next visit was to Maria Kacarovski's home where the orchids are large and thriving.

Her collection of *Dendrobium speciosum* are spiking well as are her Cymbidiums even though Maria claims there are not many spikes this year.

Jean Swindley's orchid houses are brimming with treasures many of which are small and delicate and loving their environment. Jean's Cymbidium collection, carefully set in a walkway between a fence and an orchid house, is looking good as are her pots of terrestrials. Jean's collection is quite varied and certainly very interesting.



Finally a visit to Gordon Marion's home where many of his orchids are in bud and flowering. The plants look healthy and well fed. Gordon is always experimenting and he has mounted a series of *Laelia anceps* on the side of his house and they are covered in spikes. There are about 6 large healthy plants which all came from one original plant. He is also moving some of his Dendrobiums to the garden to see how they fare there. Given the unpleasant cold and blustery conditions, the turn out of members was good. It was great to see Bruce Dennett who had travelled from Bairnsdale the day before to be with us.

A Love of Paphs.

Margaret Hayes has been involved with the species *Paphiopedilum insigne* for as long as she can remember. As a young schoolgirl of about 10, Margaret played in her Father's shadehouse where he grew his Paphs. She called it her 'Nursery Shop' and she would guide her imaginary friends through showing them the Paphs and the ferns. She was allowed to water the plants but not repot them.

Her father then built a sunroom and new fernery onto the house. A shelf was erected in the fernery on the outside of the glass window of the sunroom and the Paphs were placed on the shelf. Each year Margaret and her Father would count the flowers and keep records hoping to better the previous year's flower count. The collection of *Paphiopedilum insigne*, which had originally come from Margaret's Grandfather, grew as plants were divided.


Many of those plants are still in Margaret and Don's care as Margaret inherited her Father's collection.

The Hayes' collection has expanded and diversified over the years as Margaret and Don travelled to Shows in Sydney and elsewhere and added to their range of Paphiopedilums.
