Monthly Maintenance......

- 1. If you haven't already done so, remove the dried sheaths of spent flowers. It is amazing what can be found hiding under these, completely out of sight.
- 2. February is the time when early flowering cymbidiums start to spike. Check for spikes and stake them to prevent inadvertent damage.
- 3. Thanks to the very wet Summer, weeds have thrived in those pots not under hard cover. Try and keep these under control so they are not competing with the plant for nutrients.
- 4. Keep up the bug inspections. The wonderful new growth brought on by our Summer conditions this year is very attractive to chewing insects.
- 5. Continue to monitor the amount of rain we are having so that you can judge if or when fungal treatments are necessary.





Sphagnum Moss by Sue Carroll

In the May, 2021 Newsletter, there was an article about growing Sphagnum Moss. At the time there was a shortage of it available in Australia.

Two methods were outlined and I chose to grow it in trays over a base of used bark.

The bottom tray was set up in April and the moss was un- used. The top tray was set up a month later with discarded moss which was found in a bucket, wet and waiting to be recycled. Both are growing.

Since then more trays of used moss have been added to the collection.

They grow under the Orchid House benches in semi shade. This was recognised as a long term project and I will never be able to fill my needs, but it will be very pleasing to harvest moss (I hope) for those special plants that deserve pampering.







Editor's Orchid Spotlight



This delightful little plant, with its delicate 1cm. flowers, comes from Brazil. The flowers bloom inside the foliage, close to the pseudo bulb. It can be grown mounted or in a pot. It enjoys cool temperatures, semi-shade and constant year round moisture. This lovely example belongs to Diane and David Hay.

Some Summer Flowering Orchids...



'Easy to grow, fast growing and a great orchid for beginners,' are just some of the accolades given to this orchid.

Maxillaria tenuifolia has distinctive flowers and an even more distinctive perfume with hints of coconut.

It can be grown in pots, baskets or mounted and which ever way it is grown, it is certainly worth having in your collection.

You will not be able to show it or probably even bench it, but if you have one in your collection, you will certainly enjoy it.

Watch out for some on the Raffle Table at E.O.C meetings this year.

Gongora galeata is a very easy orchid to flower. It likes our South Coast conditions and if grown in semi-shade and hung in the orchid house, it will produce a number of pendulous clusters of fragrant flowers in January. Whilst the flowers are unusual, when in full bloom the display is quite eye-catching.

It is also fairly easy to source. This one came from 'Orchids On Newbold.'





Promenaea (Limelight x Chameleon) x Mike Leaity

This little plant, with flowers quite large for the plant size, enjoys cool conditions. It is Summer flowering and not often seen on the bench at meetings.

The pictured plant is grown under cover in Sphagnum Moss and it is in light shade most of the time. It is kept damp all year round with less water in Winter and is given weak, non-organic fertiliser in Spring and Summer.

This plant is a hybrid and was bred by David Woolf of 'Woolf Orchid Culture'.

Stanhopea tigrina

This striking Summer flowerer is rarely seen at a club night. The magnificent flowers, which pop through the bottom of their hanging basket, are quick growing and highly perfumed, but sadly last for only a few days.

They like to be grown moist but not wet.
