CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Part 1: ENTRY CONDITIONS

- 1.1 Competition in the open section is open to any financial member of any orchid club or society to whom entry is free.
- 1.2 Entries are eligible for judging in one class only, except where stated in the schedule.
- 1.3 All entries must be in show condition and free from pests and disease.
- 1.4 All entries must be made on the official entry form, available from the Eurobodalla Orchid Club.
- 1.5 All exhibits and exhibitors shall conform to the rules and the by-laws of this club and the Orchid Society of New South Wales Ltd, the judge's decision will be final.
- 1.6 Plants competing for prizes must have been owned and in the possession of the exhibitor for a minimum of six months.

- 1.7 The show marshal and committee reserve the right to reject, remove or rearrange any exhibit without necessarily giving any reason for that action and to reclassify any plant, prior to judging.
- 1.8 Entries will be received on the basis that the committee will take all reasonable care of the exhibits but shall not be liable for any loss, damage or destruction to the exhibits, and the exhibitor shall have no claim against the club or sponsors.
- 1.9 Every exhibitor will be responsible for the correct labelling of their plants.
- 1.10 An exhibitor shall not remove any exhibit before termination of the show without the permission of the show marshal.
- 1.11 All exhibits must have the exhibitor's number clearly displayed in the pot.
- 1.12 All seedlings must be placed in their appropriate genera or colour classes with the appropriate sticker or ticket marked with "S" and placed in the pot. (Note. Mericlones are not seedlings)
- 1.13 Champion Seedling is not to be considered for Grand Champion unless it has already won 1st place in its class.
- 1.14 All novelty Cymbidiums must be placed in their appropriate genera or colour classes with the appropriate sticker or ticket marked with "N" and placed in the pot.
- 1.15 Dockrillia hybrids will be included in Orchids Not Elsewhere Specified for purposes of awarding Champion Orchid not Elsewhere Specified.
- 1.16 The Novice Section will be only open to Novice members of the Eurobodalla Orchid Club.
- 1.17 All Novice exhibits must be benched in their respective classes or otherwise they will be judged as "OPEN" exhibits.
- 1.18 All plants will be eligible for prizes. First and second will normally be awarded in each class. If, in the opinion of the judges, no exhibit in any class warrants a prize, none shall be given.
- 1.19 No trophy is to be taken by a non-member of the Eurobodalla Orchid Club, the trophy will remain at the club.
- 1.20 At the discretion of the show marshal and/or judges, further prizes may be awarded.
- 1.21 All entries must be phoned through to Ms J Swindley on 0412 999 452 between the hours of 10.00am and 8.00pm.

- 1.22 All entries must be in the hands of the show marshal and placed in position ready for judging between the hours of 3.00pm and 5.00pm ON THE DAY PRECEDING THE OPENING OF THE SHOW.
WINTER SHOW on Thursday 7th July
SPRING SHOW on Friday 26th August
- 1.23 The show marshal may exercise discretion regarding the acceptance of late entries.

Part 2: DEFINITIONS

- 2.2 'Seedling' shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowering for the first time. For exhibition purposes, seedling will only retain their status of 'seedling' for the duration of the first flowering raceme. Species are now included as long as they meet the above requirements. Mericlones will not be classed as seedlings.
- 2.3 The Oncidiinae Alliance includes: Ada, Aspasia, Braasiella, Brassia, Cochlioda, Comparettia, Cuitlauzina, Cyrtochilum, Gomesa, Gudrunia, Helcia, Hispaniella, Ionopsis, Lagerara, Lemboglossum, Leochilus, Lockhartia, Macradenia, Macroclinium, Mesoglossum, Mesospinidium, Mexicoa, Miltonia, Miltoniopsis, Notylia, Odontioda, Odontoglossum, Odontonia, Oncidium, Osmoglossum, Otoglossum, Psygmorchis, Psychopsis, Rodriguezia, Rossioglossum, Sigmatostalix, Symphoglossum, Ticoglossum, Tolumnia, Trichopilia, Vuylstekeara and their hybrids.
- 2.4 The Vandae Alliance includes: Acampe, Aerangis, Aeranthes, Aerides, Amesiella, Ancistrorhynchus, Angraecopsis, Arachnis, Ascocentrum, Ascoglossum, Bolusiella, Calypstrochilum, Chamaeangis, Chiloschista, Cleisostoma, Cribbia, Cryptopus, Dendrophylax, Diaphananthe, Dimorphorchis, Doritis, Dyakia, Esmeralda, Euanthe, Eurychone, Gastrochilus, Grosourdy, Haraella, Holcoglossum, Jumella, Kingidium, Listrostachys, Luisia, Micropera, Microterangis, Mystacidium, Neobathiea, Neofinetia, Oeonia, Papilionanthe, Paraphalaenopsis, Phalaenopsis, Plectrelminthus, Podangis, Pomatocalpa, Taeniophyllum, Thrixspermum, Trichoglottis, Tridactyle, Trudelia, Vanda, Vandopsis, Ypsilopus and their hybrids.
- 2.5 The Pleurothallid Alliance includes: Barbosella, Barbrodria, Cryptophoranthus, Dracula, Dresslerella, Dryadella, Lepanthes, Lepanthopsis, Masdevallia, Octomeria, Physosiphon, Platystele, Pleurothallis, Porroglossum, Restrepia, Restrepiella, Sarracenella, Scaphosepalum, Stelis, Trichosalpinx, Trisetella, Zootrophion and their hybrids.
- 2.6 The Laeliinae Alliance includes: Barkeria, Brassavola, Broughtonia, Caularthron, Cattleya, Cattleyopsis, Dimerandra, Dinema, Domingoa, Epidendrum, Encyclia, Guarianthe, Hagsatera, Hexisea, Isabelia, Isochilus, Jacquiniella, Kalopternix, Laelia, Laeliopsis, Lanium, Leptotes, Mormolyca, Nageliella, Nanodes, Neolauchea, Noelehmannia, Nindema, Oerstedella, Potinara, Rhyncholaelia, Rhyncattleanthe, Scaphyglottis, Schomburgkia, Sophronitis, Sophronitella, Tetramicra, Thwaitesara and their hybrids.
- 2.7 The term 'specimen' refers to a mature plant exhibiting multiple racemes of flowers (four or more).
- 2.8 The term 'Novelty' is defined as having dominant features of peloric, spotted, striped, feathered or variegated flowers.

Part 3: SALES TABLE

- 3.1 The Club show sales table will only operate during the times of the show
- 3.2 All orchids placed for sale on the Club sales table must conform to rule 21 of the Club Rules for Members.
- 3.3 Part a. Of those rules state "Only well established pest and disease free plants may be offered: the committee reserves the right to reject plants without giving a reason"
- 3.4 No plant is to be offered for sale from the show bench during the period of the show.
- 3.5 Club sale plants can only be placed on the sales table during the open hours of the Show
