#### At our last meeting...

Twenty-two members and one visitor attended the last meeting and it was very pleasing to see the Novice Bench covered in plants. It was good to see the Griffiths return to a meeting.

We were treated to photographs of Garry Evan's wonderful Orchid House in Narooma. Garry created a space for his orchids along the side of his house and incorporated an entertainment area in the same space. Below his 70% shade cloth roofing he has wire between the wooden supports. This enables him to hang pendulous cymbidiums and other orchids and attach the yo yos he uses to train cymbidium spikes. The floor is sand covered by pebbles and a sprinkler system is used to keep the floor damp. The benches are wire which allows good air flow

and drainage and he has a fan installed. Garry has created an area at the back of his Orchid House for extra large plants. He waters with rainwater which is collected from the roof and stored in a tank. Garry always waters by hand with a watering can. Decorative touches on the walls which are used to highlight certain orchids add an extra touch to this already beautiful space.

Garry's method for growing Cymbidiums...... Garry's aim is to produce large plants with multiple flower spikes and here is his very successful method. He gives Terry Poulton credit for some of his ideas. 1. Garry pots on his orchids and only divides if absolutely necessary. When he is forced to divide he uses Plant Starter to help establish the new divisions. 2. He waters and fertilises very regularly, so uses a free draining mix which is composed of equal parts of Coir from Bunnings ( soaked in water and Go Go Juice), Perlite and Orchiata Bark. 3. He fertilises from October to February with Campbell's Diamond Special T water soluble NPK fertiliser and from March to September with Calcium Nitrate Prill. He also uses Epsom Salts. 4. Both Conguard concentrate and EcoOil are used as pest deterrents.

Thank you to Garry for his very informative talk.

**Thank you** also to Peter van Est for the keikis of *Pleurothallis palliolata* which he brought along for Members. In about two years our benches should be covered in this delightfully different orchid.

The winners of the Open Section were Michelle and Bruce McIntosh with their very beautiful *Oncidium* Sweet Sugar 'Million Dollars'. In the Novice Section, Diane and Peter Griffith's lovely *Oncidesa* Gold Coin Butte 'Everglades' was the plant chosen by Members as the winner.

At the next meeting...... Jean Swindley will talk to us about Show procedures, how to present an orchid for showing and how to best prepare your orchid for travelling to a Show. Labels for orchids, Entry Forms and Sales Forms will all be available and Jean will discuss how they should be filled out. It has been 33 months since a Show, so a little revision will be helpful for everyone.

**Plant Labels.....** This is just a reminder to take care when writing your plant labels for benching and especially for Shows.

If your handwriting is dodgy, try printing your labels for extra clarity. The label must include the name of the genus which always has a capital eg. *Brassavola* followed by the species or hybrid name. A capital is used to begin hybrid names, so *Brassavola* Little Stars is correctly written. Lower case is used to begin species names so *Brassavola nodosa* is also correctly written. If you are not sure about your label please check with one of the other Club Members. # Editor's Orchid Spotlight

*This lovely triangular-shaped flower presents as a single flower* on a 10 to 12 cm. stem. A mature plant can support a number of flowers at the one time. The plant is best grown in pots and baskets and left undisturbed for as long as possible. With its origins in the cloud forests of South America, it enjoys moisture all year round with a slightly drier rest in Winter. It grows in cool to warm temperatures in medium light and is ideally

suited to our conditions. Most sources report it as flowering in Spring and Summer but as with some Maxillarias there are exceptions. This beautiful flower is currently blooming happily in Jean Swindley's collection.

Wanted..... Orchid flowers and foliage are needed for the posies which will be sold at the Winter Show. This year Sue Nash and Glenda Clapin will be making posies prior to the Show. In the next Newsletter we will give exact details of time and place to drop off your orchids.

# Lesson Learned......Sue Carroll

For many years I have had a pot of *Coelogyne cristata* in my orchid collection. It has grown slowly, been divided occasionally and flowered sporadically but has not been at all spectacular.

This year it looks wonderfully healthy, with good foliage, plump pseudobulbs and a number of flower spikes. This plant grows outside, on a pole with some shade but no cover.

The only difference this year is the Summer rain, rain and more rain. Clearly in the past it has not been watered enough or regularly enough.

A little research into the background of this orchid revealed that it experiences Summer monsoonal downpours for months. Lesson learned.

Last year Michelle McIntosh talked to us about water-well pots and the incredible difference they had made to her Coelogyne Unchained Melody (C. cristata x C. flaccida) Water once again.

This is just a small example of the importance of understanding each plant's origins and therefore their cultural needs.


